



International royalties

- PAPRA and AMCOS have reciprocal agreements with other RMOs all around the globe 90+ countries.
- Each organisation licenses music use and collects the resulting licence fees (royalties) in their own territory.
- If your music is played overseas, we work with the relevant society to obtain your royalties and pay them to you.




- When your music is used overseas, it is subject to the laws, distribution rules and policies of each society.
- Societies are members of the international organisation <u>CISAC</u>, and <u>BIEM</u> for mechanical societies, which have agreed standards for distributing royalties.

Musical Works & Sound Recordings

A recorded song has two main forms of copyright.

One is for the underlying composition (words and music).

The other for the recording or "master".



What kind of royalties do we collect?

APRA

Collects Performing Royalties which include:

- Playing live at a gig or concert.
- Background music in retail, fitness centers etc.
- Broadcasts on TV or radio.
- Streaming on digital services.

AMCOS

Collects Mechanical / Reproduction Royalties which include:

- Third party commercial products (CD, vinyl, download)
- Digital services.
- Synchronising an existing song with a film/TV production by member request.

Derivative Works (from a Royalty Perspective)

1. Performance / Interpretation / Transcription (incl. covers)

- of a Copyright Work Treated as the original composition
- of a Public Domain Work Treated as the original composition – no royalties generated
- **2. Arrangement** (a structural change to existing work)
 - of a Copyright Work Treated as the original composition, unless otherwise notified by the original copyright holder
 - of a Public Domain Work Can registered as an arrangement via the writer portal
- **3. Sample or Quotation** (using a portion of an existing work)
 - of a Copyright Work Requires clearance from the copyright holders
 - of a Public Domain Work Can be registered as an original work
- 4. New Work
 - **New Original Composition** Can be registered as an original work




Registering Arrangements of Non-copyright Works

Use the APRA AMCOS website Song Catalogue feature to search for the work.

Google can also be your friend for this!

The search results will give you vital information:

- The NC work identifier to show the piece is Non Copyright.
- The registered composer/s names.


Registering a work


1. Select Work Type

Regular works are original musical compositions. Most works will fall under this category.

Jingle is for pieces which are being used in advertisements or commercials.

Arrangement applies only where you have taken another composer's work and added your own original melodic compositional elements and sections not created by the original composer.


Played live? Submit as you go and get paid!

NEW SUBMISSION

LPRs

- Form is in your portal and in the app.
- Historical claims can be either:
 - Maximum 3 years prior to the submission date, or
 - From 12 months before you joined APRA.
- Cannot claim private functions such as weddings, birthdays or house parties.
- Only one writer per band / group enters a claim.
- Include all covers you play.
- Can claim when others perform your work e.g. choirs or orchestras.
- Paid quarterly.

Releasing cover versions

If you record and release covers of other people's songs for commercial purposes, you need to obtain an AMCOS licence.


This licence covers commercially released physical recordings. It does NOT cover the use of musical works in advertisements, sampling and lyric changes OR the copying of sound recordings. You will need permission directly from the copyright owner for these purposes.

Uploading covers to digital service providers (DSP) such as Apple Music, Amazon Music or Spotify: In Australia you can supply your own recording to a DSP. APRA AMCOS licenses DSPs directly, so when your cover version is streamed, they report that to us and we pay the writers of the work.





- For performances of your works that fall outside of APRA AMCOS's usual distribution analysis or other self-reporting systems.
- Examples: music played as part of art installations, during non-televised portions of major sports matches, music soundtracking inflight safety videos, or used in short films available on YouTube.
- Each claim is individually considered by the APRA AMCOS Board's Membership and Distribution Committee.
- Only claims where the assessed royalty value is at least \$50.00 can be accepted.
- Your work/s must be registered with us before submitting the claim.
